YQCA Pre-Test and In-Person Training

Although participating in Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is beneficial for all livestock youth, it is required for those selling beef to Tyson after the County Fair or any youth exhibiting beef, sheep, swine, or meat goat at the Kansas State Fair or KJLS. Annual training can be completed online (\$12) or in-person (\$3).

In-Person Training—Tuesday, April 18, 6:30-7:30 pm or Sunday, April 23, 3:00-4:00 pm in the Sunflower Room. Please register, pre-test, and pay ahead of time at www.yqcaprogram.org. This year a pre-test is required before I can mark in-person participants complete.

- 1. Login to user account at www.yqcaprogram.org.
- 2. Hover over and click username (in blue box in the upper right of page).
- 3. Select "Enrolled ILT Trainings" towards the bottom of the list.
- 4. List of enrolled trainings will appear.
- 5. Click the blue "Pre-Test" button on the right to have each child complete their pre-test.

Pullorum Testing Changes - Poultry

New pullorum testing guidelines have been released. Going forward, routine surveillance testing will be performed a minimum of once every five years (rather than every year) for county fairs. Current plans are that Pottawatomie's first turn will be in 2024. We will not test poultry in 2023.

Foods and Nutrition Project Resources

For youth that want to perfect that Fair recipe, we are allowing check-outs of scales and oven thermometers at the Extension office. Why do I need a scale? The scales will allow youth to weigh out all their ingredients, allowing a more expert level food product. Using a scale is the only way to avoid discrepancies in your cooking. It may seem time consuming at first, but the end result is a better yield and more consistent results.

Why do I need an oven thermometer? Many ovens have a variance in their temperature. By testing your ovens temp, it allows you to see the exact measure of the internal temp of your oven to ensure even more exact cook times and results. You can then make adjusts based on that. Wanted Host Families for Japanese Exchange Summer 2023

Looking for fun and excitement this summer? Host a new friend from Japan in your home this summer, July 22 – August 17. Kansas 4-H International Exchange Programs are offering hosting opportunities for 30-35 families this summer. Host families are needed who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl. The Japanese youth will be between the ages of 12 - 16. Our responsibility is to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other.

Any Kansas family with children aged 10-16, who is interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. They can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is everyday family life. Tractor Safety Training

A Hazardous Occupations Safety Training in Agriculture course (tractor safety) will be conducted on Tuesday, June 6, and Wednesday, June 7, at KanEquip, 18035 East Hwy 24, Wamego. The class will run from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. the first day and from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on the second day. The cost is \$30 which includes materials and lunch both days. The course is taught by KSU Extension Agents from Geary, Marshall, Pottawatomie, Riley, Shawnee and Wabaunsee counties.

Any youth 14 or 15 years old who will operate a tractor, work with livestock or doing other qualifying farm labor for someone other than their parent is required to pass the course to be legally employed. Youth working on a family farm with their parents are encouraged to attend to learn safety skills on a farm. Youths age 12 and 13 are welcome to participate in the class, but cannot be certified until age 14. Youth 16 years old and older are also welcome to attend.
