How? 1. Visit v2.4honline.com

- 2. Existing login and member info has been transferred from the previous system. So only new families/volunteers need to create an account profile
- 3. When selecting payment method, choose 'Payment for this invoice will be collected by 4-H institution'. Click confirm, BUT do not send a check for payment. The fee is covered!
- 4. The State 4-H office has provided a PDF enrollment guide that can be found at this link

Re-enrollment deadline is January 1st to have your \$15 fee covered. The final date to add/drop projects is still May 1st for everyone
